

You really want to ride in the canoe. Your dad tells you he will take you for a ride after lunch.

If you sneak into the canoe and go on a ride without your dad, did you do what's right? (No)

If you are camping or playing at home, you can be a Leader (thumbs to chest) and Do What's Right (two thumbs up)!

Your mom tells you it's time for a nap. If you get in your tent and try to sleep, did you do what's right? (Yes)

If you can't go to sleep, should you get out of the tent or should you stay inside and read a book? (Stay inside and read a book)

That's right! When we obey, we are being Leaders (thumbs to chest) who Do What's Right (two thumbs up)!

Your mom packs you a lot of yummy snacks for the long hike to the waterfalls.

If you tell your mom "thank you" did you do what's right? (Yes)

Way to go! When we are kind with our words, we are being Leaders (thumbs to chest) who Do What's Right (two thumbs up)!

If you throw your sister's shoe into the campfire, did you do what's right? (No)

Throwing things into the fire is not doing what's right.

Around the fire or anywhere you go, you can be a Leader (thumbs to chest) who Does What's Right (two thumbs up)!

Let me hear you all say (put finger to lips), "Shhhh." (Kids will say, "Shhh.")

You really want to sing your favorite song out loud but you know you are supposed to be (put finger to lips) quiet at nighttime.



If you quietly whisper your favorite song, did you do what's right? (Yes)

Yes! You and I can be leaders (thumbs to chest) when we Do What's Right (two thumbs up)!

Your dad asks you not to shine your flashlight at anyone's face. You forgot what he said and shined the light in your brother's eyes.

Did you do what's right? (No)

When you don't do what's right, you can ask for forgiveness. Let me hear you all say, "I'm sorry. Please forgive me." (Kids will repeat each phrase after you.)



You want to play in the water with the swim ring, but your friend is playing with it.

If you jerk the swim ring from your friend, did you do what's right? (No)

If you want to be a Leader (thumbs to chest) **who Does What's Right** (two thumbs up), **you can SHARE toys with your friends.**

If you can share your toys, clap as fast as you can. (Kids will clap fast.)

You want pizza for lunch instead of a hot dog. If you do not complain and eat the hot dog anyway did you do what's right?
(Yes)

That's right! Even when it's hard, God wants us to be Leaders (thumbs to chest) **who Do What's Right** (two thumbs up).

If you can eat your food and not complain, let me see you rub your tummy.
(Kids will rub tummies.)

If your water bottle is empty, should you throw it down and cry or should you ask for more water? (Ask for more water)

That's right! When we control our words, we are being Leaders (thumbs to chest) **who Do What's Right** (two thumbs up)!

Let me hear you all say that after me!
(Kids will repeat.)

If you sneak more marshmallows when your mom's not looking, did you do what's right? (No)

We can be Leaders (thumbs to chest) **who Do What's Right** (two thumbs up) **when we tell the truth and are not sneaky.**

Squirrels work really hard collecting nuts. Leaders, like you and me, can work really hard doing what's right, too.

Everyone stand up. (Kids will stand.)

Let me see you work hard to say what we Need to Know today as you spin around in a circle. (Kids will spin in circle while saying what we Need to Know.)

Great job, leaders! You can sit back down and rest. (Kids will sit back down.)
